Supplementary Education Funding Agreement

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INTRODUCTION

The Halifax Regional Centre for Education (HRCE) shares a geographic boundary with the Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM). HRCE operates 136 schools serving approximately 60,000 students and employs approximately 12,000 teachers and support staff.

The HRCE and HRM share the common goal of creating a healthy, sustainable, viable, and well-educated community. This shared vision of excellence provides a framework for the annual supplementary education funding contributed to by the residents of HRM. Supplementary funding has a long history dating back prior to the amalgamation of Bedford, Dartmouth, Halifax, and Halifax County into the HRM in 1996.

Supplementary education funding supports fine arts programming, library support specialists, social workers, and other program and service enhancements for students in communities throughout the municipality.

The current five-year agreement between HRM and HRCE was extended until March 31, 2026. HRCE submits an annual report and budget to HRM outlining how and where supplementary funding will be allocated according to the agreement's terms.

The contents of this report, as defined in sections 8 and 9 of the agreement, include:

8. PROGRAM OUTCOMES

- 8.1 Each year of the Term, the Program shall be evaluated according to the following measurable outcomes:
 - (a) The number of students by grade level and family of schools who have the opportunity to receive enhanced fine arts programming in their classes; (see page 9)
 - (b) The enrollment in optional fine arts programs by grade, age and family of schools; (see pages 9-17)
 - (c) The frequency, range and locations of fine arts performances; (see pages 18-19)
 - (d) The breadth of fine arts programming available across HRM; (see pages 20-21)

(e) The number of students by grade level and family of schools who have the opportunity to receive an identifiable educational enhancement in their school. (see page 9-17)

9. ANNUAL REPORTING

- 9.1 HRCE shall provide an annual report to HRM of the expenditure of the Funding (the "Annual Report"), which shall be provided to HRM within 90 days of the end of the fiscal year beginning in 2021.
- 9.2 The Annual Report shall include the following measures:
 - (a) a summary of the Program supported by the Funding for the applicable school year.
 - (b) a description of the scope of the Program supported by the Funding, as described in Section 8 of this Agreement; and
 - (c) a budget update, including allocation for the current year and multi-year projection.

The HRCE thanks Halifax Regional Council for their continued stewardship of supplementary education funding.

SUMMARY AND HIGHLIGHTS OF PROGRAMS 2024-25

HRCE allocates supplementary education funding into the categories of Halifax Regional Arts (HRA) and other enhancements.

During the 2024-25 school year, Halifax Regional Arts (HRA) supported and enhanced fine arts in HRCE through a broad range of learning experiences in the areas of dance, drama, music, and visual arts. Goals for programming included meeting the needs of our diverse populations, understanding our diverse cultural and historical contexts, and exploring new and innovative ways to bring fine arts to the youngest residents of HRM.

This year, HRA continued to expand and adjust programming to ensure more equitable, barrier-free, diverse, and efficient delivery. Key staffing and program changes included:

- 1.0 Fine Arts Specialist added based on student-teacher ratios and areas of need:
 - 0.5 allocated to the JL IIsley Family of Schools
 - 0.5 allocated to the Lockview Family of Schools
- 0.4 allocation added for Circus programming
- 0.2 allocation added for Pottery and Glass Lab Support
- 0.1 Choir allocation provided to the West Bedford Family of Schools
- 0.3 Choral Circuit positions created by reallocating existing school choir resources to expand HRA's reach:
 - These positions served the Sackville, Millwood, Woodlawn, Citadel, and Auburn Family of Schools
- 0.2 Band Clinician added to the Bayview Family of Schools
- A tech support position was expanded to:
 - Assist schools in assessing and enhancing existing tech equipment
 - Support school productions across HRCE
 - Provide support to the Woodlawn Auditorium in the Woodlawn Family of Schools
- A new program was launched to enhance high school band programming across HRCE
- Continued and expanded support was provided for musicals and school shows, including:
 - Funding
 - Materials
 - Staff support

This year, a new three-year cyclical schedule was created to balance access and equitable delivery for some highly demanded HRA programming. The schedule ensures something for every Family of Schools every year, as well as access to each piece of programming within a three-year period. Pottery and Glass Labs, Music Therapy, and Circus Programming were balanced in this schedule. It was very well received.

Music Therapy at HRA expanded through a change in delivery to serve 23 schools and 422 students in P-3 as well as students with special needs in School Learning Centers. Sessions were provided in both virtual and in person sessions for 6 Families of Schools. These schools were Sackville, Woodlawn, Bayview, Charles P Allen, and Musquodoboit Rural Families of Schools. Inperson sessions were the primary form of delivery, but in response to different circumstances throughout the year, virtual synchronous and asynchronous lessons were made available so that students with special needs could access music therapy support.

A special Songwriter's initiative was launched engaging HRCE high school students with Nova Scotia Music Industry Professionals and New Brunswick teachers and students. 30 students took part in a two-day workshop and 20 students did a four-week Songwriter's Series.

Our Technical Program continues to provide student training, support for school shows, events, and performances, tech outreach for school sound and light systems, and provision of equipment for schools.

To promote our vision of barrier free access, food and transportation support for students happened during this school year, and we adjusted programming to occur in locations closest to students in their own environment for optimal opportunities for participation. Where possible we brought programming to students, as opposed to bringing students to programming. In addition to the work completely funded by HRA, we provided financial support to special projects and initiatives that would otherwise be unattainable for many school communities. HRA Fine Arts Specialists provide support to enhance school and regional activities through staffing in planning and organizational support, chaperoning, and facilitation. Materials are also often provided to enhance school projects.

Some online offerings provided more access this year, through events, courses and workshops and resources for teachers and student-led activities.
